Rationale

At School, leadership and staff are committed to ensuring smooth transitions through the Early Years Foundation Stage and Primary School.

Aims of the Policy

Transitions can be stressful, particularly when moving key stages. This policy aims to:

- Promote smooth transitions throughout school.
- Ensure children's well-being, involvement, and excitement.
- Support children toward independence, confidence, and adaptability.
- Provide clear expectations for children.
- Build upon established standards and progress annually.
- Inform and upskill teachers on necessary processes.

Transition from Home/Nursery to EYFS

Communication and Activities:

- Readiness Webinar: Guest speaker session.
- Readiness Workshop: In person face to face guest speaker session.
- Information Evening: Parents meet the Leadership Team and receive information.
- **Term 3 Transition Preparation Activities:** Includes FS1 and FS2 playdates, children are invited to spend time with an FS teacher and students joining in September.
- **Zoom Story Sessions:** Teachers introduce themselves to new students one week before the children begin school.
- **Early Transition for Additional Needs:** Personalized sessions for children needing extra support.

Staggered Start:

- FS1 and FS2: First week of term, 2 hours per day in small groups.
- Individualized Programs: For children struggling with separation from parents/carers.



Transition from EYFS to Year 1

Ensuring Smooth Transitions:

- Staffing: Deployment of staff with EYFS and Key Stage 1 experience.
- Learning Environments: Collaboration between Key Stage 1 and FS teachers to maintain consistency.
- Data Handover: Sharing assessment information to cater to individual needs.

Training and Collaboration:

- Collective Expertise: Year 1 and Early Years teachers observe and collaborate.
- Joint Sessions: Opportunities for FS and KS1 to join relevant sessions
- Gradual Curriculum Adaptations: A gradual shift from play-based to more structured learning.

Transition Activities:

- End of Term 1: FS2 activities, Meet the Teacher on Zoom, introduction of BYOD.
- First Week of School: Off-timetable for settling in.

Placement of Twins

Promoting Individual Development:

- Primary Phase: Twins are placed in separate classes to develop independence and social skills.
- **Foundation Stage:** Parental input is considered for class placements, familes are recommended to spearate twins.

Reassessment:

• Flexibility: Placement may be reassessed based on educational and developmental needs.
